Using John William Waterhouse's oil painting called "The Magic Circle" and recreating it on an illustration board and having it next to the illustration using essential oils at a dance studio to heal a broken foot can show the representation of self-expression. By combining different pages from the book Heart A History by Sandeep Jauhar and painting a realistic heart on top of them it can show the significance of the heart to a person. Using Vincent Van Gogh's Skull of a Skeleton with Burning Cigarette for the realistic style along with oil paints the idea of self-expression of how when one family member is going through something that can be shown through this mixed media piece.

Family

The belief of a guardian angel is assigned to protect and guide a particular person. When my dad died everyone told me that I had gained a guardian angel by my side. By painting a picture from when I was younger with my dad and adding guardian angel wings, I can show how one could believe this idea. Being inspired by Grant Wood's American Gothic, can help the viewer see the realistic side of the painting along with the traditional beliefs of a guardian angel.

The Last Dance

A dancer can tell their life story through a dance. Dance is an important piece in someone's heart and if taken away for short periods of time it can feel like a lifetime. This is what I wanted to capture with the "Last Dance" showing how a dancer is unable to dance due to an injury. Inspired by Edgar Degas Blue Dancers the oil painting can capture the self-expressing feeling of being trapped and unable to do what they love to do.
